RECORD OF DISCUSSIONS HELD WITH
THE SECRETARY (EXPENDITURE) ON 08.05.2026

The meeting with the Secretary (Expenditure) held in a very cordial and constructive atmosphere. The discussions were conducted on the basis of the agenda finalised by NEC, AICAOA, which mainly covered important issues such as the prolonged stagnation of Sr. AOs at Level-10 for 14–15 years, treatment of AAOs as Direct Entry, implementation of the judgment in the matter of PAO to Sr. AO promotion and other related concerns.

The meeting commenced with the felicitation of the Secretary by our President through the presentation of a planter, followed by a brief introduction of the delegates. Thereafter, the Secretary invited the delegates to place their views before him.

The foremost issue highlighted by Secretary General, AICAOA was the severe stagnation being faced by Sr. AOs. In support of our submissions, a comparative chart showing the career progression in CSS, CES, IFS (A), IFS (B), and CCAS was presented before the Secretary to demonstrate the disparity and hardships faced by the cadre.

The Secretary patiently heard all the issues and made sincere efforts to understand the reasons behind the stagnation and other grievances. AICAOA explained in detail the various administrative hurdles and factors contributing to these longstanding issues and also discussed possible remedial measures.

The Secretary stressed upon that wherever there is any difference in understanding between the Department and the Association, both sides should sit together and deliberate upon the matter in detail for a better resolution of issues. In this regard, AICAOA requested that a joint meeting with the concerned officers/staff may be convened at the earliest to deliberate upon the issues and explore possible solutions. All agenda points were thereafter explained comprehensively, and the Secretary assured the Association that the issues raised would be looked into sympathetically.

The Association remains committed to pursuing all genuine issues of the cadre with sincerity and determination. Further developments in the matter will be shared with all members in due course.
